Sweet corn is in the pack! Sweet corn for full shares is in a bag with names on it. We also have All Blue potatoes, squash, cucumbers, tomatoes, an onion, kale, chard and lemon basil.

Zucchini Noodles



Zucchini noodles are the rage here at the farm. Dana uses a shredder (shown on the left). Julianna uses a potato peeler to make long strips. Both of them lightly salt and then message the strips to make them more pasta like. Removing the skin is optional.

For pack lunch, we sautéed some onion and chard and lemon basil, then added some heirloom tomatoes and the noodles. We tossed them thoroughly and topped the dish with walnut pieces.

We topped the pasta with parmesan cheese on our plates and enjoyed it thoroughly with some crusty Bread Oven baguette slices. The recipe is attached.

Blessed Rain and Sweet Corn

Last night it rained 0.5"! We had gone here without measurable rain for 54 days. The roads and garden were filled with dust, the high tunnels were covered in dust and the plants were covered with dust. When we came in from the field we were filthy with dust in our eyes, ears and noses. This rain is splendid!

Sweet corn is in the pack again. Of course there are worms and bugs. We have cut out any sign of worms.

I just wanted to share with you why this is good. It means no chemicals! Non organic sweet corn has seen a lot of chemicals. First an herbicide pre-emergent is applied to the soil. The seed is treated with a root worm fighting chemical closely tied to the disappearance of honey bees. Once the corn is up, it is sprayed with ear worm chemical, corn borer chemical and the soil is injected with anhydrous ammonia fertilizer.

Like the canary in the mine, the ear worms and borers are proof you are not eating any chemicals!

We have added eggplant to the pack. Also in the pack are garlic, onions, kale, chard, zucchini, cucumbers, basil, broccoli green bean tidbits for stir fry and tomatoes.

More Zucchini Noodles!



This week Dana treated us to zucchini lasagna made with our zucchini, tomatoes, basil, garlic and onion. This dish is vegan and raw. She set it in her dehydrator for 15 hours at 105 F. Also, instead of cheese, she uses raw cashews and macadamia nut that have been soaked in water for about 20 minutes. The flavors were warm and rich. We had it with a kale, tomato and cucumber salad with coconut vinegar and olive oil dressing. The recipe for the lasagna is attached!

The lasagna can be baked in a warm oven of 180F for about 20 minutes instead of the dehydrator.

Tomato Yields Down from Hot Weather Last Month

The 100+ F weather last month has dramatically affected our tomato yields this month. High temperatures kill pollen and reduces the number of baby tomatoes (called "sets" in the gardening world) and also makes the plants go dormant.

The good news is that they are waking up and tomatoes that have been green for weeks are starting to ripen. So our picking yields are way down from 3 weeks ago. It is steadily picking up so we hope to be back to normal soon.

We expect the numbers of tomatoes in the share boxes to pick back up again next week.

Neighbor's Pears

Julianna and Kelly picked pears from their neighbor's tree (with permission). The trees are old and unsprayed or chemically adulterated.

Terry, Casey and Andrew are scheduled to pick pears and possibly apples from one of our neighbors, Randy, who is also a CSA member. So we should have pears in both packs. One thing we have learned, is that pears should be picked before they are fully ripe to keep them from getting grainy.



Garlic and Potatoes

The 100+ weather earlier this year has taken a toll on our potato harvest. We had to cull out over 50 percent of our crop because the potatoes about 6 inches from the surface were baked in the hot soil, and then rotted. Now it looks like the same thing may have happened to our garlic. We are finding spoiled garlic. Not all of it is damaged and we are trying to sort it out before you get it in the pack.
